News from the Trailhead Gifts Restore Range Light's Shine

While work continues on the site of our new trailhead and interpretive center, we have some other exciting news to share this month.

Ridges members Marge Binder and Sarah Wright have generously agreed to fund the remaining amount needed to fully restore the Lower Range Light. Prior to receiving their gifts, The Ridges had raised just over \$23,000 and had earmarked those funds for the replacement of the range light's foundation.

We are currently in the final stages of obtaining the permits necessary for the project and are also pursuing Wisconsin Historical Society approval of the restoration plan. Restoration work will be performed based on recommendations contained in the Historic Structures Report issued by Restoric, LLC, in 2010. Since both

Marge Binder(l) and Sarah Wright with founder Olivia Traven's son, Lee Traven. range lights are on the National Register of Historic Places, the restoration will also adhere to specific guidelines delineated by the Secretary of the Interior.

With the future of the Lower Range Light secured, we will turn our attention to the eventual restoration of the Upper Range Light. Any monies in excess of the amount needed to complete work on the Lower Range Light will be allocated to that future project.

The Lower Range Light, although a modest structure, is historically significant. Range lights are counted among the most vulnerable type of rapidly-disappearing lighthouses, and both the Upper and Lower Range Lights have been identified as two of the only surviving examples of range lights in Wisconsin.

Ride for Nature Results

The numbers are in, and this year's Ride for Nature hit new heights in fundraising for The Ridges Sanctuary. On top of the \$8,000 generated by the Ride itself, over \$5,000 more was generated by the addition of several new fundraising opportunities, resulting in a **grand total of over \$13,000**.

The new Bike to Benefit sponsorship program gave riders a chance to raise sponsorship money for the benefit of the Sanctuary and to compete for prizes. To help launch the new program, the **Cordon Family Foundation** offered to match the first \$1,000 in sponsorships. Total Bike to Benefit proceeds, including the matching gift, equaled \$3,573.

Our top three fundraisers, **Megan Leonard/Sarah Kifer (team)**, **Josh Leonard and Deanna D'Abbraccio**, received Ride for Nature bike jerseys and Saris bike racks. Congratulations to them and to **Becky & Ray Diver**, **Donna Gallardo and Mandy Hagman** for reaching their goals and making the Bike to Benefit program a success.

The Door County Beer Festival also helped us raise an additional \$1,656, thanks to sales of our popular pretzel necklaces and proceeds from the Beer Garden donated by Flanigan Distributors.

This year's Ride attracted 734 cyclists, a new participation record for the event.
