LOOKING AHEAD

Hunting Procedures

The Ridges will once again allow gun deer hunting on approved lands from **Saturday, November 23 – Sunday, December 1, 2019**. The Sanctuary was established to protect and preserve the unique flora of this area. White-tailed deer, with historically and unnaturally high population densities, are threatening the existence of such plants as the Showy Lady's Slipper. Even though hunting is not allowed on established trails, all Ridges Sanctuary Rustic Trails are closed during the gun deer hunting season. Hidden Brook Boardwalk will remain open; hike at your own risk, blaze orange mandatory. In addition, Ridges land purchases that have been made with funds from the Knowles Nelson Stewardship Fund (Appel's Bluff), require that land be opened up for a variety of public uses, including all hunting and trapping seasons. Registration forms, guidelines and property maps are available online at RidgesSanctuary.org or at the Ridges' office, 8166 Hwy 57. If you have any questions or wish to report violations of DNR hunting laws, call (920) 839-2802 or the Door County Sheriff at (920) 746-2400.
