

ABSENTEE BALLOTING DECISION

This past winter the Ridges asked its membership to weigh in on the subject of absentee balloting for the annual meeting. The Board of Directors is aware that many members are unable to attend the meeting, and wondered how many would vote in absentia if given the opportunity.

The response was negligible. Of a total 1,500 member households, only 10 people expressed an interest in absentee balloting. Because absentee voting presents significant logistical challenges and the interest is so low, the board has decided against instituting this change.
