The Ridges Sanctuary, along with our partners in conservation, invites you to join us in celebrating the natural beauty of the Door Peninsula at the 22nd Annual Door County Festival of Nature, May 24th-26th. The theme of this year's festival is **Community**.

Door County is a special place for many reasons. One of the most beautiful things about Door County is how people care for the land. Those who lived here long before us had the foresight to protect diverse ecosystems all along the peninsula. Even now, as the number of visitors on the peninsula increases with each passing year, there is a network of people who share this same connection. They work to build relationships between people and nature, inspiring stewardship and a land ethic will transcend generations.

As a culture, we tend to think of the natural world and humans as a dichotomy. We overlook our backyards in favor of "pristine" national parks and wilderness areas, categorizing cities as *developed* and nature as *wild* – the anthropocentric vs. the ecocentric. While protected land was and is incredibly important to maintaining a network of biodiversity, we must not forget that people and nature are and always have been interconnected. Humanity is not the counterpart to the natural world but rather a part of it. We must care for each other and the planet.

To me, community is not a description but a practice. In nature, community is the way trees use mycorrhizal networks to communicate with one another underground. Community is how Black-capped chickadees use their complex calls to warn their flock. Community is to recognize that caring for others and the planet is, in turn, caring for oneself.

This year, let us celebrate the individuals, organizations, and ecosystems that make Door County the incredible community that it is by connecting people and the planet.



### **PLANNING YOUR TRIP**

#### **Transportation**

Transportation for field trips is NOT provided unless indicated in the trip description. Carpooling may be an option for some trips and will be managed at your and the trip leader's discretion. Some field trips may require a Wisconsin State Park Pass. Passes can be purchased at the entrances to state parks.

#### **Field Trip Tips**

Please plan to arrive 15 minutes early to check in with your trip leader. We suggest bringing your own bug repellent, sunscreen, water, and appropriate footwear and clothing.

#### Weather

Be prepared for variable weather throughout the season. Lake breezes moderate the local temperatures and can change within a matter of hours. Field trips will run rain or shine but will cancel in the chance of severe or threatening weather conditions.

#### Meals

Meals are not included in the registration fees.

#### **REGISTRATION**

The 2024 Festival of Nature offers a full slate of field trips, classes, and activities throughout Door County. **Registration opens Monday, March 18th.** There is a maximum number of participants allowed for each field trip or program, so registering early is the best way to ensure you get to participate in the activities you want. Registration is easy – go to www.RidgesSanctuary.org or call 920-839- 2802. We'll confirm your registration by email.

\*Registering online offers the best chance of securing your spot in the field trips of your choosing. You are welcome to call us if you are unable to register online, but please be patient and understand that we do not have the capacity to answer all phone calls immediately when registration opens. Because we will not be able to check voicemails until later in the day, please keep trying until you get through to someone.

#### **PROGRAM FEES**


Program fees per field trip vary from \$30 to \$65 per person, per program. Prices are listed in each program description. Members of The Ridges Sanctuary receive a \$5 discount per person, per program.\* Program prices for youth under the age of 16 are 50% of the full price. When registering as a member or as youth, please be prepared to provide membership details and/or date of birth in the registration portal.

Please note the location of your field trip. A park pass may be required unless otherwise indicated for field trips in a state park.

# CANCELLATION & REFUND POLICY

The *Door County Festival of Nature* reserves the right to cancel an activity or field trip when necessary. If a trip is canceled, you will be notified as soon as possible so that you may select an alternate trip or receive a full refund. Please make sure to provide us with a phone number for last-minute communications. You can cancel your registration by email or phone. Cancellations made 30 days prior to the program start date will be refunded in full, minus a \$10 processing fee. Cancellations made between 8 and 29 days prior to the program start date will be refunded at 50% of the total fees. Refunds will not be issued for cancellations made less than 7 days prior to the program start date.

While growing up in St. Louis I spent a lot of time at the city's zoo and art museum, both of which offer free admission and are across the street from each other. I grew up thinking that creating art required an almost magical, inborn talent, but when I had to learn scientific illustration in graduate school, I learned that such skills could be developed. I also realized that doing science and making art have much in common. Besides doing illustrations for my biological work, I have made collaborative pieces with UW-Green Bay

I am a scientific illustrator and printmaker from Chicago, whose work celebrates flora and fauna. My passion for the natural world has led me to pursue a career and creative endeavors in environmental science. I earned a MA in Conservation Biology from Miami Ohio focusing on science communication. I currently serve as the Beach Water Quality Project Manager for the Chicago Park District and design signage for the Park District's natural areas. Using my artistic abilities and academic expertise, my aim is to inspire hope and conservation action in others.

As a curious naturalist, I hope to continue to learn about the natural world and share my discoveries through art. My creative practice highlights delightful details with intricate illustrations. My work primarily uses micron pen, watercolor, and carved linoleum. Since 2018, I have showcased my art at Brushwood Center at Ryerson Woods in Illinois during its nature-inspired winter and spring art markets. My work makes the invisible visible by exploring ecologic themes of habitat, interdependent relationships, migration, and native wildlife. I hope to foster empathy for the living things in our backyards

and beyond. Through my artwork, I want to spread awareness about the ecosystem humans are a part of and advocate for all wildlife that shares our home. After all, in the words of Baba Dioum, "In the end we will conserve only what we love, we will love only what we understand, and we will understand only what we are taught."
